I also attended the Australian Tennis Championships, the National tennis event for players with an intellectual disability. We are always seeking new charities which meet the criteria represented under our five pillars. Overall Taverners Victoria contributed \$35,550 to our beneficiary charities in 2016-17 and nationally the contribution was over \$275,000.

FIRSTLY The Lord's Taverners Foundation (LTF) has been formed to allow members and supporters of the Taverners to make donations of \$2 or more, that are tax deductible to the donor. These donations will be available for distribution in accordance with giving the young a sporting chance.

THIRDLY Test Great Adam Gilchrist has been appointed as our inaugural Taverners National Ambassador. His appointment was enthusiastically endorsed at a function at The Sydney Cricket Ground on 16th August this year and the interview he had with Kerry O'Brien was brilliant.
